Highlights

The Veolia Institute has contributed to the major meeting for climate negotiations designed to find an international agreement COP21. It has naturally chosen to structure part of its 2015 activities around this event. It **focused on the theme of methane**, using its resources to raise awareness about this short-lived climate pollutant, which is still insufficiently addressed in strategies to reduce GHGs emissions.

Before the COP21: A high level **international Conference** on methane emissions mitigation, on November 9, 2015, at the Economic, Social and Environmental Council (ESEC);

During the COP21: Two **side-events** at the official venue to disseminate the outcomes of the Conference closer to decision makers and civils society actors.

Official recognition

UNFCCC has granted the Institute the "Observer NGO" status; giving the opportunity to follow the official discussions and organize a sideevent in the blue zone.

Government.
